Summary of Meeting's Action items:

- *Second meeting of the Task Group for Eutrophication.* Chair/**Wright** convened the meeting at 9:05 a.m.

Team Members present included: **Dworzecki, Frauson, Gass, Ngsala, Wright and Zimmerman**. Also attending were: **Eric Parker** – Central Michigan University, **Kylee Williams** – Community Member and **Jo Ellen Strieter** - Administrative Contractor.

Motion by Frauson to approve the meeting notes of our Eutrophication Task Group Meeting from September 10, 2018. **Motion seconded by Dworzecki. Motion carried without dissent.**

Wright – We will move forward on having two separate committees 1) **Education and Outreach** and 2) **Restoration/Delisting**.

Education and Outreach Sub-committee – We should build on the number of efforts leading to limiting the amount of phosphorus let into Saginaw Bay contributing to excess algae growth. This group will meet at 9am before the Partnership Board Meeting (Normally first Monday of each month). Committee Members include: **Brook, Dworzecki, Frauson, Gass, Ngsala, Ogar, Parker and Wright**.

Restoration/Delisting Sub-committee – will focus on the gathering of sources under 303D & 305B list. These lists have set standards and we need to build a mechanism within the already defined standards. This group will meet at 12pm after the Partnership Board Meeting (Normally first Monday of each month). Committee Members include: **Dworzecki, Ngsala and Wright**.

Gass mentioned availability of Soil Test Kits to Bay County residents to purchase for a minimum charge. If residents next to the bay did soil testing before lawns were done in the spring that would be a good start as to what their phosphorus levels are.

Motion by Dworzecki to adjourn the meeting at 9:55 am, **seconded by Frauson**.
